Satelligence is proud to be working with BMW on providing more transparency with respect to their environmental standards. Satelligence engages with businesses like BMW to help them understand supply chain risks, like deforestation, to improve their sourcing performance. This requires the combination of traceability and compliance monitoring, i.e. the exhaustive mapping of suppliers and supply chain linkages (e.g. identification of all the source farms in leather supply chains and trade relations) combined with systematic satellite monitoring and social data analysis to verify environmental and other issues at all farms previously identified.

Forward-thinking clients implement Satelligence's full service as such, yet other clients start with a pilot first - sometimes based on verification of selected previously identified issues and/or third party farm data.

Depending on the service level and contractual arrangements, the responsibility to provide stakeholders with the results and necessary assurances ultimately lies with the client. Satelligence is dedicated to protecting the confidentiality and privacy of information entrusted to it.

That said, we work with all stakeholders across supply chains. If third party supply chain data is available, which does not infringe confidentiality and privacy of information, Satelligence is able and willing to provide full analysis of supply chain risks for any corporation under research.
